	the chant. Say Look at the chant, please! Draw pupils' attention to the first verse and explain its meaning. Ask them to pay attention to the letter A/a and the words apple, bag and the sentence There's an apple in the bag. Check comprehension. - Play the recording for pupils to listen and to get familiarized with the tune, saying Listen to the verse, please! Then play the recording again, ask pupils to listen and repeat, line by line, saying Listen again and repeat, please! After that, play the recording for them to listen and repeat until they feel confident. Give further support to those pupils who find it difficult to do the task.	Individually
	- Follow the same procedure with the verse. Show pupils how to chant and clap their hands. Correct pronunciation, if necessary Play the recording all the way through.
