

Comparative adverbs

– For most adverbs (ending in  **ly** often with two or more syllables), we make comparative forms by adding *more*.

slowly → *more slowly* *carefully* → *more carefully*

– For adverbs (with one syllable) that have the same forms as adjectives like “*fast, hard, soon*”, etc., we make comparative forms by adding *-er*.

fast → *faster*  *Hard* → *Harder*

– Some irregular adverbs:

better *Badly* → *worse*

well → *better*



- He drives faster than her.
- She drives more slowly than him.

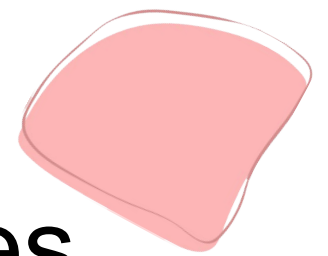

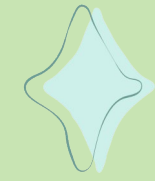
